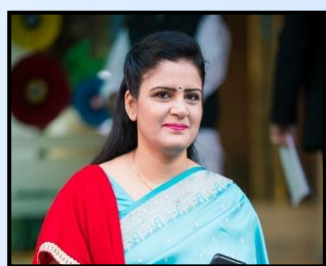

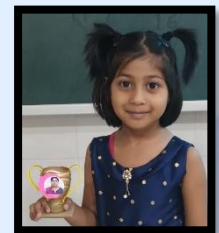


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MOTHER'S DAY

EID marks the culmination of the fasting month of Ramzan.



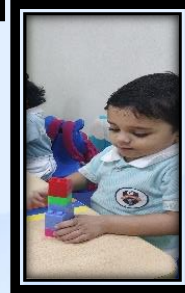
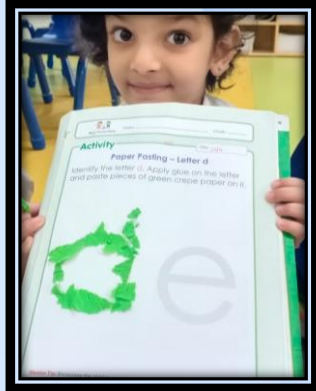

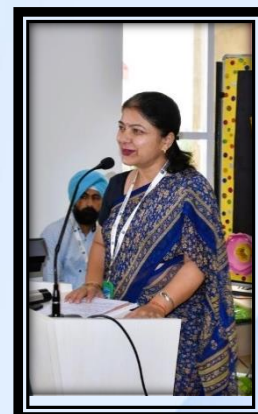
PSIS believes in nurturing Global Leaders by providing International Platform to our students through International Collaboration with schools in Russia, UK and US.

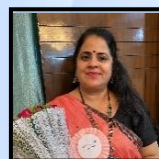

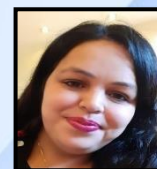
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
